
June 3, 4, and 5th - Cheese Festival weekend – An Open House will be held on

Parents of future driving students,

Minnesota law requires children under the age of 18, who wish to drive, to attend 30 hours of classroom instruction and 6 hours of behind the wheel instruction with a Department of Public Safety certified instructor. Children 14 years of age and older are able to attend; however, they cannot obtain their permit until their 15th birthday.


If you are interested, please log onto our website www.pantherdrivingschool.us for more information. Class is limited in size. Costs are \$150.00 for the classroom instruction, \$175.00 for the behind the wheel instruction for a total cost of \$335.00. Classroom tuition is not due until the first day of class and behind the wheel payment is not due until those lessons start, but you may pay all at once if you wish to do so. Flexible options for paying are always available.

We also offer the 6 hour of driving instruction to children that have had the classroom portion through another driving school. The cost for this is \$200.00

For all driving lessons, we will pick your child up and drop them off at your house. Usually the lessons are 1.5 hours each for four sessions, but we can also do three lessons of 2 hours each.





Early Childhood Screening

EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING TO BE HELD IN PINE ISLAND

October 5th and 6th

Enter through Community Ed Entrance, not the main doors—

Pine Island Elementary

Early Childhood Screening is a free check of a child's growth and development provided by Pine Island Public Schools. Screening in early childhood supports readiness for kindergarten and promotes positive child health and development. If any areas of concern are identified, children can get the help they need before starting school. **Children are required to have a screening before kindergarten entrance**, unless a conscientious objection is filed.

The next Early Childhood Screening is being held **Wednesday, October 5th and Thursday, October 6th**. This screening is for any unscreened child who:

- **Is between the ages of three and four.**
- **Is over four and has not yet been screened**

Screening at age three is ideal, as it provides the earliest time to offer support and resources to children and families. The screening tools are adjusted for a child's age, so waiting for a child to learn more skills before screening is not recommended and provides no benefit. It can also delay care for any areas that may be of concern.

The screening includes height and weight, vision and hearing, and a developmental screening, which looks at the child's thinking, language and motor skills. Parents will also have a health and immunization review with a nurse, followed by an exit interview. Early childhood screening includes a vision screening that helps detect potential eye problems, but is not a substitute for a comprehensive eye exam.

Call the Pine Island School at 356-8785 or Community Education at 356-8876 to schedule your appointment. Appointment times range from 7:30 AM until 3:00 PM and take about an hour and a half. **Attending any preschool or ECFE classes or having well child check-ups with your doctor does not eliminate the requirement for screening.**

Transportation

Children who attend 3's and 4's or School Readiness **may** be able to ride the school bus to school in the morning or home from school at the end of the day. If you would like your child to ride the bus you **must request** a transportation form from the Community Education Office. The form must be turned in to the Community Education Office when completed. Preschool children cannot ride the bus unless they are **with an older sibling or older daycare children**. The bus stop must be a pre-existing bus stop. The form must be approved by the transportation and Community Ed directors to confirm that there is enough room on the specific bus. School bus transportation begins approximately the 3rd week of school. Hiawatha Transit is also a convenient option (see page 19).



School Readiness (Panther Preschool)

School Readiness (Panther Preschool) Students 4 and 5 years old (eligible for kindergarten in the fall of 2017) will work on pre-kindergarten skills, such as large and small group socialization, listening, taking turns, following directions, and becoming familiar with school and school routines. We will be using a curriculum called Reading Streets which fully aligns with the kindergarten curriculum. We will also be working on concepts such as counting, pre-math and pre-reading skills, letter and number recognition, shapes, colors, printing, and beginning to use the computer. The children will be able to participate in story time, art projects, gym, and playground activities. Children also learn Spanish, sign language, and visual phonics each week. Parents will be offered opportunities to attend informal parent sessions, special events, and other parent-child activities.
